Face to Face

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

- Physical presence
 - Able to move around
- Whiteboard
- Group and pair work

- Mix of face to face and self access study
- Usually using VLE
- Pearson first publisher to have quality VLE
- Traditional workbook online

- Involves technology
- Not all teachers have experience
 - with online teaching
 - Feeling of isolation
- Classroom management issues



Hybrid Lessons



- Mix of Face to Face and Online
 - ✓ Maximise student numbers
 - Some students physically in classroom
 - \checkmark Others following live on line
- No new teaching skills needed
- Same quality for both



Advantages of Hybrid Lessons



- Students don't miss lessons if sick
- Possible to teach the whole class at the same time
- Engage with teacher pre and post course (EFL only)
- Avoid double work



Hybrid Lessons


- Investment in technology
 - Laptops / tablets for in-school students
 - Video conferencing equipment
 - Mobile phones
 - Headphones
 - IWB
 - Projector and screen
 - Bluetooth keyboard



Flipping the classroom


Flipping the classroom (also known as "inverting" a classroom) is a "pedagogy-first" approach to teaching in which course materials are introduced outside of class, and inclass time is re-purposed for inquiry, application, and assessment in order to better meet the needs of individual learners.

Flipped Lessons



- Turning the lesson on its head
- What is traditionally done at school ...
 - ... is now done at **home**
- What is traditionally done as **homework** ...
- ... is now done in **class**





Flipped Lessons



- More one-to-one time between teacher and student
- More collaboration time for students
- Students learn at their own pace
- Encourages students to come to class prepared
- Teachers gets to work with weaker students
- Guide on the side

- Online learning
- Videotaped lessons
- Pure blended learning

- Intentional Content
- Professional Educator
